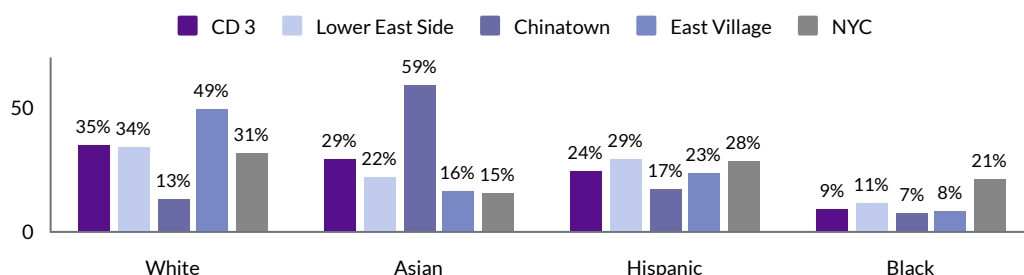
### Population

**153,000**

The majority of residents in Manhattan Community District 3 (CD 3) are White, Asian or Hispanic. The population of CD 3 is older than NYC. CD 3 has long been home to a number of immigrants. Many residents speak a language other than English at home, with Chinese and Spanish being the most common.

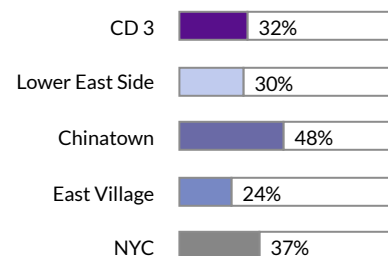
### Race and Ethnicity

% individuals by race and ethnicity



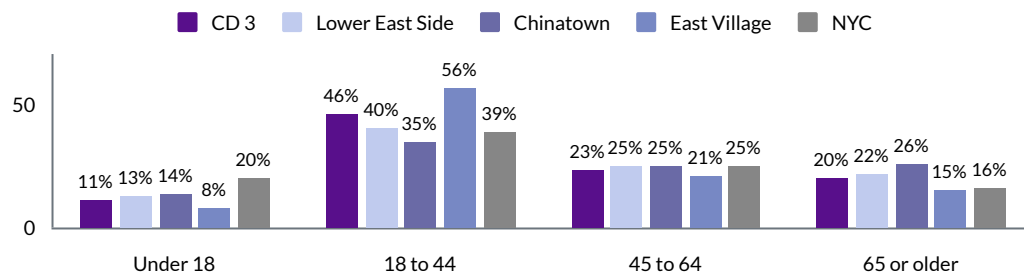
### Birth Place

% individuals born outside United States



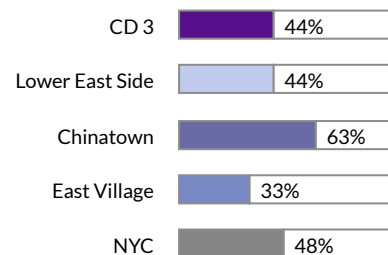
### Age

% individuals who speak language other than English

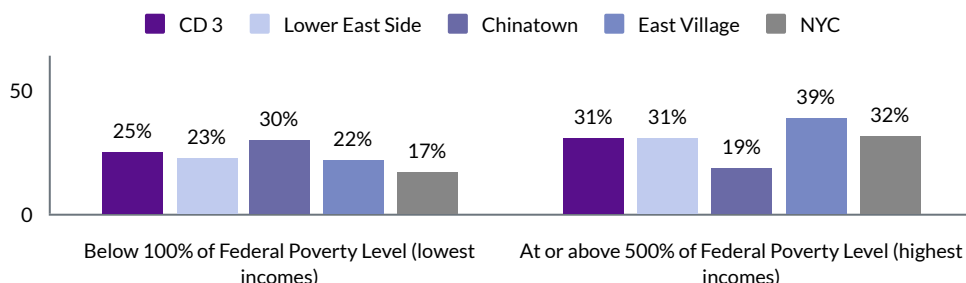


## Income and Housing

Overall, the poverty rate in CD 3 is higher than NYC overall and stands in contrast to adjoining wealthier neighborhoods in Lower Manhattan. Poverty rates are even higher among older adults in CD 3. In recent years, new housing developments have attracted wealthier residents. Within the same block, residents can have incomes at the lowest and highest levels. This economic variety can mask poverty and social needs. CD 3 is home to many public housing developments. Many renter households are severely rent-burdened (paying 50% or more of income on rent).

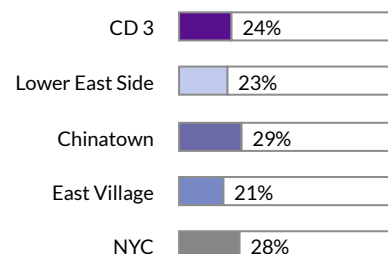
### Poverty and Wealth

% renter-occupied housing units paying 50% or more of income on rent

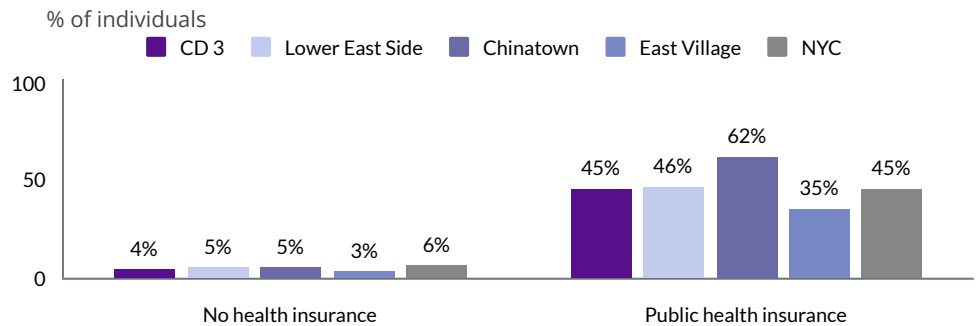

### Health Insurance

Overall in CD 3 a similar percent of residents do not have health insurance as residents citywide.

In Chinatown, nearly two-thirds of residents have public health insurance.

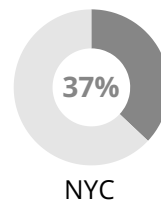
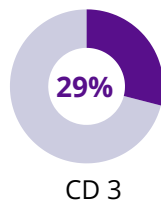

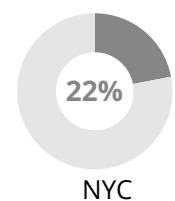
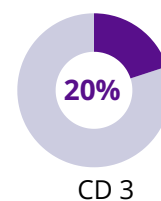
### Basic Needs

Many New Yorkers have trouble meeting their basic needs for food or housing. While lower than NYC, more than one-quarter of CD 3 adults experienced food insecurity. About one in five adults in CD 3 were delayed paying rent or mortgage, similar to adults citywide.

#### Food Insecurity



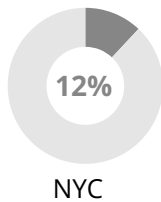
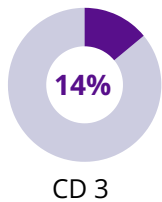
#### Delayed Paying Rent/Mortgage



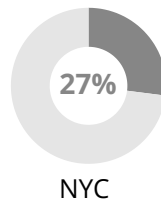
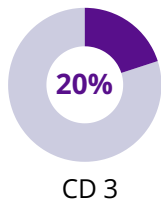
### Adult Health

A similar percent of adults in CD 3 have diabetes, obesity, and high blood pressure as adults citywide.

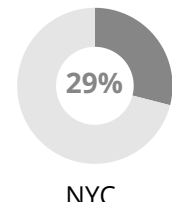
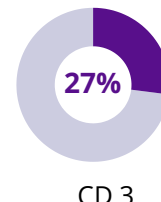
#### Diabetes

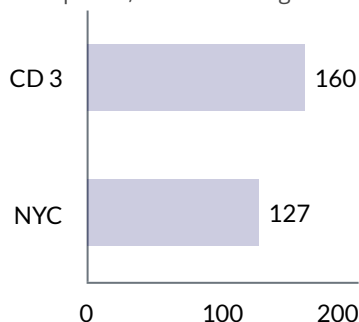
### Children's Health

#### Asthma ED Visits

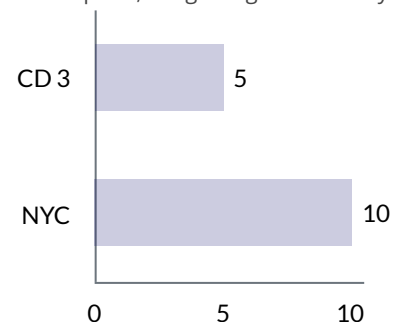
Rate per 10,000 children aged 5 to 17 years
