

Residents have high employment rates and are civically engaged in projects that improve the employment options and environmental resiliency of their community. Most residents in Sunset Park are Hispanic/Latine or Asian. Sunset Park has long been a first destination for immigrants. The majority of Sunset Park residents speak a language other than English at home. Fewer Sunset Park residents have a high school or college degree than residents citywide.




42% of Hispanic/Latine residents in Sunset Park are Mexican, compared to **14%** citywide

90% of Asian residents in Sunset Park are Chinese compared to **47%** citywide


Birth Place

% individuals aged 5+ years by language spoken at home




67% of Spanish-speakers in Sunset Park and 46% citywide speak English less than very well

Income


Average Earnings for Workers

% individuals below poverty level




Housing

Most housing units in Sunset Park are renter-occupied. Sunset Park has one of the highest percentages of crowded housing units in NYC.


Home Ownership


Data at a Glance

Health Insurance

A higher percent of Sunset Park residents lack health insurance than residents citywide. This is largely due to the difference in health insurance rates for adults 19 to 64 years old, including many employed adults, who do not have health insurance. Sunset Park has a higher percent of residents with public health insurance than residents citywide.


No Health Insurance

% individuals with public health insurance




Basic Needs

Delayed Paying Rent/Mortgage







High Blood Pressure





Children's Health


Low Birthweight

Percent of births <2,500 grams




Asthma ED Visits
